Randy and Bonnie Robinson

Randy was raised taking it easy, standing on the corner in Winslow, Arizona. He came from a family of four boys. His father was a railroad engineer and until his passing last spring, at 96, was one of the last persons alive that had operated a steam locomotive on the Santa Fe railroad in the West. Randy wanted to follow in his dad's footsteps but his dad told him the railroads were downsizing and that airplanes were going to be the future of travel.

Due to the type of boy he was, his parents sent him to Kemper Military School in the South for a couple years. He also attended Arizona State College in Flagstaff, then ASU in Tempe, and Washington State University. Randy worked in many different fields including ADOT, the lumber industry, farming, and even the railroad before heeding his dad's advice and going to work for The Boeing Aircraft Co. in Seattle, WA. During his career at Boeing, he worked in many facets of aircraft manufacturing including: assembling planes, one of which was the first 747; parts manufacturing; Human Resources; Machine Tool Design & Fabrication; Engineering Training; and Machine Cutting Tool Manufacturing. After over 35 years with Boeing, he retired, at 53, in factory management.

Randy met his wife, Bonnie, when her step-father, who worked with Randy, invited him to their home in Renton, WA for Christmas. Randy and Bonnie got married after Randy moved 30 miles north to Everett, WA to work in Boeing's new 747

aircraft plant. Bonnie worked at Boeing for over 12 years before retiring. Her first car was a 1952 Chevy coupe. She then got a 1956 Ford Sunliner convertible that had a problematic 3 speed column to floor conversion tranny. She cruised the loop in Renton in it.

Randy's first car was a 1929 Ford Model "A" Coupe he bought for \$100. He worked on it then sold it for \$500 in under 6 months. He was 13 years old at the time. Some of his other cool cars were a 1932 Chevy coupe, 1950 Oldsmobile coupe (the Turtle), 1926 Peace Arrow touring car, 1957 Oldsmobile Tri-Power, 1957 Chevrolet Bel-Air black on black convertible, 1963 Ford Galaxy XL 500 convertible, (titled as 1958) Mercedes 300 SLR Gullwing Coupe, 1967 Ford Fairlane GT, and a 1946 Chevrolet pickup. Randy would like to have most of these cars back. They were all his favorites.

The Robinsons have enjoyed many things in their 45 years of marriage including extensive travel from the coasts of the Baja to the Arctic Circle. They have also enjoyed cruising the Caribbean, Dutch Antilles, Panama, Mexico, Canada, and Alaska.

After retiring, they bought their first home in SCW in 2001 and moved to their present home on the Stardust golf course in 2003. When not in SCW, they are either at home in Sequim, WA or touring the country in their motor home with their Toy Australian Shepherd, Little Blu. Every year, they take the motor home to Nampa, ID to visit their son, John, and grandson, Zachary.

Randy and Bonnie bought 300 feet of virgin salt water front property in SW Washington and spent 3 years planning and building their beach summer retirement home. Two months after it was completed, it burnt to the ground. In 2004, they were planning their new beach home when Randy was found to have terminal melanoma cancer and was told he had less than a 10% chance to make 1 year. Due to his prognoses, they bought a summer home on the Dungeness Golf Course in Sequim, WA, close to Bonnie's aunt.

Randy and Bonnie's present classic vehicles in AZ are a 1957 Chevrolet Bel-Air and a 1937 Duesenberg Tiffany Restro-mod/Tribute car. They purchased the 1957 Chevrolet last summer by San Francisco on their way back to SCW, and bought the Duesenberg in 1998 near Salt Lake City.

Last summer, Randy bought and restored a 35+ year old Classic 22 Crestliner Nordic cuddy cabin boat. Then he purchased and started restoring a 45 year old Volkswagen Trike with a Harley chopper front end that come with a tear drop trailer. He also has a 30+ year old H/D Ford diesel truck he is doing a restoration on. Randy presently belongs to four car groups in AZ alone, along with many other clubs. He enjoys the camaraderie of all the clubs.

How fortunate we are to have this wonderful couple in ARC. Randy did a great job chairing the raffle for the Car Show in January. He is always willing to help in whatever way he can.
